- WHEREAS, ACCESS will enhance the sponsoring organizations ability to make their income lines, and
- WHEREAS, ACCESS commits the Student Association and Auxiliary Services Corporation to a cooperative partnership to support one component of President Weber's 5-Year Plan, and

WHEREAS, ACCESS further seeks program support from Residence Life and Housing program funds because Residence Life and Housing's population is a population that is most easily reached by campus publicity means and the programs should be eligible for the Resident Assistant program requirements, and

Student Association 6,569 x \$2.00/student = \$13,138.00 Res. Life & Housing 4,000 x \$1.00/resident = \$4,000.00 Auxiliary Service Board match = \$17,138.00 \$34,376.00

WHEREAS, eligible events for ACCESS funds have been targeted as follows:

WHEREAS, the following procedures have been suggested:

\*A complete list of SA members is placed in the Box Office for each event.

\*One (1) free ticket is available to the above events to Student Association members on a first-come first-serve basis up to 3 weeks prior to each event.

\*Current SA ID must be presented. SA member signs list near their name.

> \*Funds are controlled by the Student Association. Sponsoring organization accounts are credited based on debit of ticket value from the ACCESS account.

\*Remaining balance at the end of the year is returned proportionally to the contributors. e.g. 50% to Auxiliary Services Board x % Student Association x % Residence Life and Housing.

WHEREAS, Some advantages to Student Association include:

\*The value of the SA membership increases because tickets to cultural/multicultural events are available at no cost to students.

\*SA funded organizations are enabled to meet their income line. (SA funds are recycled to SA.)

\*Funds from Auxiliary Services Board support SA organizations sponsored events thereby increasing SA income line.

\*Funds from Residence Life and Housing support SA organizations sponsored events thereby increasing SA income line.

WHEREAS, SA funding for this proposal is contingent upon favorable action by the Auxiliary Services Board during their March funding cycle, and

WHEREAS, SA favorable action on the proposal will have great influence in affecting the outcome of the ACCESS proposal by the Auxiliary Services Board, and

WHEREAS, SA action will also have influence on the consideration by the Residence Life and Housing program fund, therefore
