- WHEREAS, the State University of New York currently has proposed legislation regarding Intercollegiate Athletics Programs Fiscal and Accounting Procedures, and
- WHEREAS, this proposed legislation would result in students loss of control over their own mandatory student activity fee, and
- WHEREAS, this would lead to increases in the costs of administering these programs, and
- WHEREAS, this would also result in the loss of several thousands of dollars in interest income for these Student Associations, and
- WHEREAS, this loss of revenue in conjunction with the expected increases in costs would lead to increases in the Student Activity Fee, and
- WHEREAS, students are opposed to these "forced compliance" programs that lead to involuntary increases in our activity fee and loss of control, and
- WHEREAS, this proposal is not only opposed by the students but also by the Mens and Womens Athletics Departments and the administration of SUNY College at Oswego, therefore

Be it resolved that the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego wholeheartedly rejects any and all efforts to take control of the Student Activity Fee and opposes the proposed legislation regarding the funding of Intercollegiate Athletics Programs.

- WHEREAS, on November 4 the voters of New York State will be asked to vote on the Environmental Quality Bond Act, Proposition One, and
- WHEREAS, Proposition One reads "Shall chapter 511 of the laws of nineteen hundred eighty-six, known as the environmental quality bond act of nineteen hundred eighty-six, authorizing the creation of a state debt in the amount of one billion four hundred fifty million dollars (\$1,450,000) to provide moneys for the preservation, enhancement, restoration, and improvement of the quality of the state's environment be approved?", and
- WHEREAS, if Proposition One is approved \$1.2 billion will be allocated towards hazardous waste cleanup and \$250 million will be allocated towards land acquisition, municipal and urban cultural parts, and historic preservation, therefore

The Add/Drop ad/hoc committee of the Student Association Senate was established during the Fall of 1986 for the purpose of researching the present add/drop policy and determining if an extension of the add/drop policy is feasible and needed, and

WHEREAS.

This committee has conducted an information search consisting of interviews with students, faculty and administrators, and

WHEREAS,

Said information has shown that the present add/drop policy does not allow students an adequate amount of time in which to make a decesion about dropping a class, and

WHEREAS.

Said information has also shown that an overly extended drop period has led to abuse in the past, and

WHEREAS.

It is the opinion of the Student Association Senate that changes in the add/drop policy are warranted, therefore

Be it resolved that the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York College at Oswego whole-heartedly supports the following recommendations and encourages Faculty Assembly support of the following recommendations through the Academic Policies Committee:

- 1) That the last day to drop a semester course be extended to 15 (fifteen) academic days into the semester
- 2) That the last day to withdraw from a semester course be extended to 22 (twenty-two) days into the semester
- 3) The maximum number of credit hours a student may register for at final registration without special approval be lowered to 15 (fifteen) hours exclusive of lab and physical education courses.

WHEREAS,	The Faculty Assembly adopted the Student Services Council's Resolution Concerning the Arming of Public Safety Officers, and
WHEREAS,	Officers Jerrett and Coates of The Department of Public Safety have sent Dr. Radley a letter requesting the re-evaluation of the arming of Public Safety Personel based on a number of life threatening situations cited in the same July 9, 1986 letter, and
WHEREAS,	The Student Association Senate on the State University of New York College at Oswego has reviewed the aforementioned documents as prepared by the Student Association Executive Branch, the Faculty Assembly and officers Jerrett and Coates, and
WHEREAS,	The prime function of the Public Safety Department at the State University of New York College at Oswego is to protect the college community, and
WHEREAS,	The campus environment issuch that mutual respect and support exist between public safety and all members of the college community, and
WHEREAS,	Oswego Public Safety officers begin their professional preparation with a minimum of either an Associated Degree in Criminal Justice or 90 semester hours of college credit, and
WHEREAS,	Oswego Public Safety officers graduate, within in one year of their appointment, from a ten-week police academy and participate in additional educational modules, and

Department of Public Safety Personel re-qualify every six months

for proficiency in the use of Deadly Physical force, and

WHEREAS,

A number of life threatening incidents have occurred, as detailed in the letter from officers Jerrett and Coates, therefore

Be it Resolved that the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York College at Oswego recommends to Dr. Radley and the College Council that a formal liason structure be created between the Public Safety Department, Administration, Faculty and Students for the sole purpose of facilitating communication between said parties, and

Be it further resolved that a process is recommended to be developed which will define, review and evaluate the handlings of incidents on campus, and

Be it further resolved that a process is recommened to be enacted and implemented that will handle performance or personel crises of Campus Safety officers which might prevent them from exercising good judgement in the event of their need to use deadly force, and

Be it further resolved that the process of peer evaluation, supervision and review within the Public Safety Department be re-evaluated, and that new policies be created to strengthen the process if deemed necessary.

WHEREAS, The Governor's proposed \$60 million rehabilitation project will initiate badly needed physical improvement on many SUNY residence halls thus ultimately enhancing the quality of student life, and

WHEREAS, Financing of this project is by bonds, as proposed by the Governor, is adding to SUNY's dommitory debt, and

WHEREAS, This debt, which is one of the expenditures that determines room rent cost, is currently the highest of its kind in the country in terms of per student cost (\$450 per student), and

WHEREAS, High debt payments coupled with declining enrollment and increased utilities costs will have a ballooning effect on room rent, and

WHEREAS, High room rent will have a devastating effect on SUNY such as limiting SUNY's accessibility and creating a climate for the establishment of policies like mandatory living, therefore,

Be it Enacted that the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York College at Oswego strongly urges Saul Weprin, Chair of the Assembly Ways and Means Committee, John Marchi, Chair of the Senate Finance Committee, Edward Sullivan, Chair of the Assembly Higher Education Committee, Kenneth LaValle, Chair of the Senate Higher Education Committee, and their respective committee colleagues to reject this proposal by the Governor, and

Be it Further Enacted that, recognizing the importance of this project, it is urged that the above mentioned legislators replace the Governor's proposal with a project of the same dollar amount that is financed by state purpose funds, and

WHEREAS.

President Reagan has proposed an approximate 46% cut in federal

funding of Higher Education, and

WHEREAS,

Within this massive cut he has proposed the total elimination of the College Work Study Program, the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Program, and the State Student Incentive Grant Program (which goes to fund the Tuition Assistance Program) and,

WHEREAS,

Other federal financial aid programs including Pell Grant, National Direct Student Loan Program, and Guaranteed Student Loan Program are receiving cuts and being restructured to negatively impact students, therefore
