#### PREAMBLE

WE, THE STUDENTS OF THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK
COLLEGE AT OSWEGO, IN RECOGNITION OF THE RESPONSIBILITY SHARED
BY THE ADMINISTRATION, THE FACULTY, AND THE STUDENT BODY IN
STUDENT LIFE AND AFFAIRS, HEREBY CONSTITUTE THE STATE UNIVERSITY
OF NEW YORK AT OSWEGO STUDENT ASSOCIATION, BELIEVING THAT BY
ORGANIZING IN THIS WAY WE CAN BEST ACCOMPLISH THE FOLLOWING
PURPOSES: TO SERVE AS AN APPELLATE AGENCY FOR PROBLEMS REFERRED
TO THE STUDENT ASSOCIATION BY STUDENTS OR STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS;
TO PROMOTE IN THE INTEREST OF THE COLLEGE COMMUNITY, A PROGRAM
OF SERVICE, SOCIAL ACTIVITY, AND EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS.

## CONSTITUTION OF THE STUDENT ASSOCIATION

#### OF THE

STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK COLLEGE AT OSWEGO (as revised on October 22, 1981)

#### Article I

#### Section I

All legislative power herein granted shall be vested in the Senate of the Student Association.

#### Section II

- 1. The Senate shall be composed of members chosen annually by the living center or centers. (The term living center shall be defined in the By-Laws of this constitution.)
- 2. All Senators shall be regularly enrolled students of the State University of New York College at Oswego with an accumulative grade point index of at least the college minimum for good academic standing, and each shall at the end of his election be a member of that living center and shall remain a member of that living center for the duration of his office.
- 3. Senators shall be apportioned among the several living centers within the college according to the respective numbers in the living centers. The enumeration shall be made 30-60 days prior to the All Campus Election on the basis of estimated membership. The Senate shall determine the number of Senators to be chosen by each living center or group of living centers. The number of Senators shall never exceed 66 nor be less than 33. No living center shall be denied representation.
- 4. When vacancies occur in the Senate by resignation or otherwise, by the Executive Authorities of the living center or centers, affected, and eventually filled by special election conducted among the residents of such living centers.
- 5. The Vice President of the Student Association shall be the President of the Senate, but shall have a vote only in the event of a tie.
- 6. The Senate shall choose its other officers, and also a President pro tempore, in the absence of the Vice President, or when he shall exercise the office of President of the Student Association.

- 7. The Senate shall have the sole power of impeachment and trial of impeachments. In all cases of impeachment the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall preside, except in the case of his own impeachment in which case the Vice-President of the Student Association shall preside. No person shall be convicted without the occurence of 2/3 of the members present.
- 8. Judgement on cases of impeachment shall not extend further than to removal from office, and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of honor or turst in the Student Association.

#### Section III

- Senators may be elected at an open election of the members of their living center or living centers group.
- 2. The Senate shall assemble at least once every full academic week during the college year, except during the weeks of examinations and the first week of the fall semester.
- 3. All Senators shall be elected at the time of the All-Campus Elections.

#### Section IV

- 1. The recourse to recall a Senator shall be in the hands of the constituencies from which the Senator is elected; to be conducted in the following manner:
  - a. Senators from Dormitories: 20% of the dorm populations must petition for Senator recall. This would require a referendum to be held, and, if 2/3 of those voting are in favor of a recall, the Senator will be removed from office.
  - b. Commuter Senators: 20% of the commuter population who voted in the last election must petition for Senator recall. This would require a referendum to be held, and if 2/3 of those voting are in favor of a recall, the Senator will be removed from office.
- 2. The Senate may determine the rules of its proceedings, disipline its members for disorderly behavior, and with the concurrence of 2/3 of the total Senate, expel a member.
- 3. The Senate shall keep a journal of its proceeding, and from time to time publish the same, and the yeas and nays of the Senate on any question shall, at the desire of 1/5 of those present, be entered in the journal.

#### Section V

No Senator shall, during the time for which he was chosen hold any other civil office under the authority of the Student Association and no person holding any office under the Student Association shall be a member of the Senate during his continuance in office.

#### Section VI

Every bill which shall have passed the Senate, before it becomes law, shall be presented to the President of the Student Association. If he approves it he shall sign it; but if he returns it with his objections to the Senate, they shall enter the objections in the journal and proceed to reconsider it. If after such reconsideration 2/3 of the total Senate agrees to pass the bill it shall become law. But in all cases the vote of the Senate shall be determined by yeas, nays, and the names of the persons voting for and against the bill shall be entered in the journal. If any bill is not returned by the President within 10 regular class days after it has been presented to him, the same shall be law, in like manner as if he has signed it, unless the Senate by its adjournment prevents a return in the form of a vote, in which case it shall be law.

# Section VII

The Senate shall be emposered:

- 1. To supervise the All-Campus Election;
- 2. To assess a Student Association tax (This tax shall be uniform throughout the Student Association.)
- 3. To determine the expenditures of the Student Association tax for the general welfare of the Student Association;
- 4. To have authority to make recommendations over all matters of policy affecting student welfare under this constitution;
- 5. To determine the line of succession to the Office of Student Association President following the Student Association Vice President;
- 6. To initiate and enact any legislation necessary to implement foregoing powers or to fulfill the purpose of this constitution as set forth in the preamble except where such jurisdiction shall be denied by the policies of the State University of New York or the State University of New York College at Oswego.

# Section VIII

- No money shall be drawn form the treasury, but in consequence of appropriations made by law, and a regular statement and account of the receipts and expenditures of all money shall be published from time to time.
- 2. The Senate shall pass no law regarding the internal operation of any student organization recognized under the authority of the office of the Dean of Students.

# Section IX

1. Upon presentation to the Senate of a Bill and a petition containing the signatures of 2/3 of the number of on campus students and 1/1/2 of the number of off campus students requesting a referendum, the Student Association Senate shall then determine the validity of the signatures within one week. When and if the required number of signatures are found valid, the Student Association Senate shall then conduct the requested referendum within 27 academic days.

However the Senate shall not be obligated to conduct the referendum if the petitions are not validated 27 days before the last day of classes or if the said referendum does not comply with Student Association and SUNY guidelines. If the referendum is passed by the student body it shall have the same standing as a Bill passed by the Student Association President.

2. The Senate may, by 2/3 vote of the total membership, submit any bill to the Student Association who shall accept or reject it; and if accepted the said bill shall have the same standing as any bill passed by the Senate and signed by the Student Association President.

#### Article II

#### Section I

- 1. The executive power shall be vested in the Student Association President, who shall together with the Student Association Vice President, be elected by an All-Campus Election. The All-Campus Election shall be held at the earliest practical date during the period from the 15th of February to the 15th of March; and held office for a term of one year commencing the first day of April of the same year in which they were elected.
- 2. The President and Vice President shall be regularly enrolled students with an accumulative grade point index of at least two-tenths of a point (.2) above the college minimum for good academic standing, and shall not be eligible for graduation until the completion of the semester in which the term of office ends. The President at the beginning of the fall semester during his term of office shall be at least a first-semester junior with the minimum number of credits to be considered as such, and the Vice-President shall be at least a second-semester sophomore.
- 3. In the event of inability of the President to discharge the powers and duties of his office, the same shall devolve on the Vice President.

## Section II

1. The Student Association President, before taking office shall take the following oath of office:

I do solemnly swear (of affirm) that I will faithfully execute the office of President of the Student Association, and will to the best of my ability, preserve, protect, and defend the constitution of the Student Association of the State University College of New York at Oswego.

#### Section III

The duties of the Student Association President shall include:

- 1. The presentation of a legislative program to the Senate at the first meeting following his election and at the beginning of each semester;
- 2. The appointment, with the consent of the Senate, of all the officers whose appointment shall not be otherwise provided for:
- 3. The presentation of periodic messages upon the State of the Student Association to the Senate;
- 4. The execution of all legislation of the Senate for which he shall be responsible to the Senate, except where a specific executive department shall be given authority, in which case the appropriate executive head shall be responsible to the Senate.

#### Section IV

- The Student Association President shall be empowered to:
- 1. Require the opinion in writing of the priciple officer of any executive department upon any subject relating to the department;
- 2. Convene such special sessions of the Senate as he shall deem necessary;
- 3. Recommend to the Senate such measures as he shall deem necessary and expedient;
- 4. Enter into agreements with agencies and organizations outside the college community by and with the consent of the Senate and the proper college authorities;
- 5. Represent the Student Association personally, and through his appointed representatives, in all its dealings with agencies and organizations outside the college community;
- 6. Assume such other executive powers as shall not be denied by the policies of the State University of New York or the State University of New York College at Oswego, or by this constitution.

## Article III

# Section I

The judicial power shall be vested in a Supreme Court and such lower courts as the Senate shall establish. The number and manner of selection of justices of the Supreme and lower courts shall be determined by the Senate and the appointments of the Justices of the lower courts shall be for one year. Justices of the Supreme Court shall serve from the time of their appointment until they shall vacate their office by resignation or otherwise.

#### Section II

The Senate shall establish such administrative offices as it shall deem necessary for the operation of the Supreme and lower courts and the Supreme Court shall appellate jurisdiction over any lower court created by the Senate.

#### Section III

The judicial power shall extend:

- To all cases to which the Student Association shall be a party except as otherwise stated in the following parts of this section;
- 2. To the student approval of all local student organization constitutions;
- 3. To any case involving the constitutionality of an act or ruling of the Student Association;
- 4. To any case involving violation of an act of the Senate except as otherwise stated in the following part of this section;
- 5. To any dispute between students, or between student organizations, if no lower court, housing unit court, executive committee or commission, judicial board, or standards committee shall have prior jurisdiction, in which case the trial or hearing was conducted properly with the power to demand such cases back to the original trial body;
- 6. And to any other case where jurisdiction shall not be denied by the policies of the State University of New York College at Oswego.

## Article IV

This constitution may be amended in the following manner: Upon the signing of a petition by 2/3 of the number of voters in the previous All-Campus Election, or by a 2/3 vote of all the members of the Senate, an amendment may be presented to the Student Association within two weeks after the presentation of the petition, in the case of such a presentation, to be accepted or rejected, and if accepted shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of this constitution.

# Article V

- All engagements with organizations or agencies outside of or within the college shall be as valid against the Student Association under this constitution, as under the Associated Student Body Council.
- 2. This constitution, and the laws of the Student Association which shall be made in pursuance thereof, and all the authority of the Student Association shall be the supreme law of student life at the State University of New York College at Oswego except where they may conflict with the policies or practices of the State University of New York or the State University College at Oswego.

3. The Senators before mentioned and all executive and judicial officers, of the Student Association shall be bound by oath or affirmation to support this constitution.

#### Article VI

The ratification of this constitution shall be determined by at least a quorum vote of the Associated Student Body Council.

# Article VII

This constitution shall take effect immediately and shall be implemented by the present Associated Student Body Council.

## **BY-LAWS**

- 1. A living center shall be defined for the purposes of Senate apportionment to one of three categories as follows: (a) on campus residence halls, (b) off campus residence units recognized as residence halls by the college, and (c) commuters (all students not resideing in living centers categorized by a or b above). The Senate shall determine each year the grouping of the several living centers for the purpose of apportionment and enumeration of Senators to be elected by these groups of living centers. These By-Jaws may be amended by a 2/3 vote of all the members of the Senate.
- 2. Permanent speaking seats shall be awarded to:
  - (a) A representative of the Office of the Dean of Students
  - (b) A representative of the Office of the Co-ordinator of Student Activities
  - (c) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court
  - (d) And to the delegated representative of any organization which the Senate shall designate by a majority vote.
- 3. The legislative session shall be one (1) year in length and shall begin on the first day in April and shall end on the last day of March of the following year.
- 4. All meeting of the Senate shall be conducted by Robert's Rules of Order.
- 5. Civil officials shall be:
  - (a) President and Vice President of the Student Association
  - (b) Senators of the Student Association
  - (c) Justices of the Supreme and lower Courts
  - (d) Chairman and members of the various departments and the committees of the Student ssociation Executive and Judicial Branches.
- 6. A Senator or Justice at his own discretion may choose to participate in any of the various departments and committees of the Executive Branch of the Student Association for the purpose of aiding him in discharging the duties of his office.
- 7. These By-Laws may be amended by a 2/3 vote of all the members in the Senate. All By-Laws to this constitution shall be subjuect to interpretation as bills under the provision of Article I, Section IX of this constitution.
- 8. This association is not organized for profit nor for the pecuniary gain of its members, officers or other private persons. It may not issue stock or declare or distribute dividends. No part of the income of the association shall endure to the benefit of any member, officer, or other person except it may pay a reasonable compensation for services rendered in effecting one or more of the association's purposes, and no member, officer, or other person shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the association assets on dissolution of the association. Any balance of money or assets remaining after the full payment of association obligations shall be directed exclusively to the furtherance of educational purposes.

- 9. Upon the dissolution of the association, the members, after payment of the just debts, obligations and liabilities of the association, will dispose of all its assets by transfer to such other not-for-profit organization(s) or organized and operated exclusively for educational purposes, or such other purposes as shall at that time qualify for exemption under Section 501 C(3) of the internal Revenue Code and Section 420 of the New York Real Property Tax Law as, in the judgement of the members, is best qualified and competent to promote the purposes of the association.
- 10. No part of the activities of the association shall be carrying on propoganda, or particiapting in, or intervening in (including the publication or distiribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.



# Office of the Vice- President

Student Association affects many aspects of a students life. Through our nearly half million dollar budget, S.A. funds nearly all extra and cocurricular activities on campus. From hockey games to meetings of the Economics Club, the S.A. budget provides the resources for diverse social, recreational, educational and cultural activity.

Strangely enough, S.A. suffers from somewhat of an identity crisis. Ask a student where the \$75.00 S.A. fee goes and the reply is invariably limited to "concerts, the Vice President's salary, and I don't know". Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

The following policy procedure and schedule be implemented for the operations of Student Association elections:

#### I. Schedule

- A. Petitions will be available at the S. A. office in Hewitt Union beginning at noon 40 calender days before the election is to take place.
- B. All petitions must be turned into the S. A. office by 3:00 p.m., 28 calender days before the election is to take place.
- C. An official slate of candidates will be posted on the S. A. bulletin board in the lobby of the Hewitt Union and at the desks of any residence halls involved, not more than three (3) school days after the petitions are due.
- D. Campaigning may begin with the posting of the official slate of candidates. In order for a student to be eligible for S. A. campaign funds, it must be determined by the Elections Committee that the student is a bona fide candidate according to the specifications of this bill and S. A. guidelines; bona fide candidates will be notified 26 calender days before the election is to take place.
- E. No electioneering is to take place within 100 feet of the polling booths (tables) after 8:00 a.m. the day before the pollis opens Electioneering shall be defined as any posters, pamphlets, leaflets, or boher prints or written documents, or formal or informal speeches stating candidate or party platform whose purpose is to work for the election of any candidate or party.

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#### II. Method of Balloting

- A. Student Association validated I.D. must be presented to poll watchers who will then check it against a master list which will then be marked.
- B. Official Temporary I.D.'s or receipted bills for the current semester will also be accepted, provided they show payment of the S. A. fee.
- C. Method of balloting will be the same for all polling places.
- D. Balloting may be either by paper ballot or by certified voting machines, whichever is decided by the Elections Committee.

#### III. Method of Control

- A. \$700.00 be allocated from the Student Association Fiscal Budget to be set aside in a special account solely for the purpose of financing the campaigns of the candidates for the offices of S. A. President and S. A. Vice-President in the annual all campus elections. The following guidelines will apply to this fund.
  - 1. Each candidate will add an additional \$15.00 to the aforementioned fund on the day that campaigning begins. The candidate will then and only then have the right to draw up to \$85.00 from the fund.
  - 2. No candidate will be allowed more than \$85.00 in S. A. campaign funds from this account. All funds spent on any campaigning must come from this account. No donations of any form may be taken (including materials). Reca This
  - 3. If it is determined that more than ten students are eligible for the Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidacy, the sum in this account shall be evenly divided between each candidate.
  - 4. If a Presidential candidate and a Vice-Presidential candidate wish to campaign on the same ticket as "running mates" they must state this intent on their respective petitions. They will then be allowed, if they so desire, to combine the funds allocated to them from the aforementioned account.
  - 5% No candidate shall be allowed to spend S. A. campaign funds for any other purpose other than his/her election campaign. If there are more than

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- ten (10) candidates, each one may put into the fund the number of dollars it takes to make up the difference between the amount she/he is allocated from the S. A. campaign fund account and \$85.00.
- 6. All disbursement of campaign funds must be made through the Finance Department of the S. A., rigidly complying to present policy specifications. These include: a) no charged purchases (without a purchase order); and b) packing slips, invoices and actual campaign merchandise received must be identical.
- 7. All unused funds from this account shall be returned to the S. A. general fund.
- B. No candidate shall be allowed to work as a poll watcher at a polling area.
- C. The operation and control of the elections shall be the Election Committee, which shall be defined as the standing Senate Election Committee, chairperson (or co-chairpersons if desired), and Election Committee members. The specific duties, responsibilities and structure of the Election Committee are described in Section IV of this bill.
- D. The Election Committee shall report the tally to the Senate in the form of a bill. Passage of the bill makes the tally "Official".
- E. Selection of Names on ballot.
  - The selection process will be done by the Election Committee in the presence of all candidates so choosing to attend.
  - 2. The selection order by offices shall be as follows:
    - -President
    - -Vice-President
    - -College Council
    - -Auxiliary Services Board
    - -Faculty Assembly
    - -S.A.S.U Delegates
    - -Senator(s)

Each office shall be selected individually. This shall also be the order that they will appear on the voting machines.

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- 3. Selection of names for each office will be done in a random fashion.
- 4. For the selection of President and Vice President, the names from both offices will be put together and then drawn randomly. Exceptions to this will be only if "running mates" want their names side by side on the ballot. In this case the names of the Vice Presidents choosing this option will be eliminated from the random drawings. This decision must be made before the random selection has begun. This method allows both Presidential candidates and Vice Presidential candidates that do not have running mates to have the chance of their names first on the ballot.
- F. Any discrepancies, infractions or violations of the Election Bill shall be recorded by the Elections Committee.
- IV. The Elections Committee
  - A. Further Responsibilities, Duties and Powers of the Elections Committee
    - 1. The Elections Committee shall be responsible for reviewing the qualifications of persons submitting petitions:
      - a) Determining compliance with all listed qualifications as found in Article I, Section II, part 2 of the Student Association Constitution (for Senators) and with Article II, Section I, part 2 of the Student Association Constitution (for President and Vice President). This shall include determining if the potential candidate is a gegularily enrolled student, in good standings with the college, paid the Student Association fee, and has an adequate cummulative grade point average for the position the potential candidate is petioning for.
      - b) Determining the validity of the petitmon of each potential candidate as described in Article X, Section A and B only.
  - V. Duties and Responsibilities of the poll watchers
    - A. The poll\_watchers shall be responsible for specific hours while attending the polling place.
    - B. The poll watchers shall be responsible for mpkingisure the ballot box is never left unattended.

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- C. The ingll watchers shall be responsible for making sure that each person voting is of the proper constituency.
- D. Only assigned poll watchers shall be allowed to check I. D.'s and master lists, unless otherwise notifying their supervisors.
- E. If poll watchers are to receive a stipend for their work, they must sign in and out on the provided sheet at the poll table each time they work at the polling place.

### VI. The polling Place

- A. Each polling place shall include the following:
  - 1. Poster(s) clearly identifying the polling place and containing the necessary election information for that polling place.
  - 2. Chair and table. Visible on the front of the table shall be a sign identifying the polling area.
  - 3. On the top of the table mentioned in part 2 above will be 1) a sheet of all necessary instructions for the poll watchers, 2) a sign in/out sheet for the poll watchers if they are to receive a stipend for their work, 3) the ballots and ballot box if the election is being done by paper ballot, and 4) the proper student directory listing(s) for that polling place.
  - 4. Poster(s) containing instructions on how to vote (including write ins) shall be readable from the polling table.
  - 5. In the case that voting machines are used, the machines must be placed in the immediate are of the polling table.

#### VII. Stipends

- A. All stipends must be approved by the Senate with the following two exceptions needing approval only by the Elections Committee.
  - Stipends for poll watchers. This shall be at the rate of \$2.00 per hour.
  - 2. Stipends for persons involved in the delivery of certified voting machines (if they are used), and in the programming thereof.

- A. Polling supervisory area shall consit of one or more polling areas. The determination of the specifice supervisory areas shall be decided by the Elections Committee.

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### IX. Appropriations

- A. The Senate shall annually allocate funds for the general elections account. All expenditures from this account must be approved and signed by the Election Chairperson and then proceed through the normal S. A. finance procedures.
- X. A. All signatures must be from one's constituency. A person may sign more than one petition.
  - B. Each petition for Senator must contain at least 50 legible signatures. Each petition for a campus wide post must contain at least 250 legible signatures.
  - C. Candidates must obtain the signatures in person.
  - D. Manner of validation process shall be decided by the Election Committee.
  - E. A sheet of instructions shall be included with all petitions.
  - F. Campus wide and Senatorial petitions shall be available from the S. A. office, residence hall desks as welllas the LOCO office.

### XI. Enumeration

A. All Senate seats are based on living areas. There is one Senator for approximately two hundred students. The following is a list of living areas and their respective number of Senate seats:

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#### XII. Election

- A. Any candidate must receive 10% of the vote of the constituency of that election in order to be considered. Constituency shall be defined as the total number of votes cast for a particular position.
- B. Absentee balloting
  - Absentee ballots may be issued to any student so qualifiedgas a voter in the Student Association and is not able to vote at his or her specified polling place for some justifiable reason such as an internship, student teaching assignment, illness, etc.
  - 2. To receive an absentee ballot the voter must notify the Election Committee in writing either by a specific application designed by the Election Committee or just a written and signed request stating name and address of the requester.
  - The requesters name will automatically be marked off the proper master list at the start of the elections and that person will then only obeyable to vote by the ballot received by the Election Committee.
  - 4. All returned ballots must be received at the S. A. office by a time coinciding with the closing of the polls on the last day of the election.
- XIII. Any infractions shall be reported directly to the Supreme Court. If it is determined by the Student Association Judiciary that one or more of the provisions of this will have been violated by any candidate, the minimum penalty will be forfeiture of his/her candidacy for that election and the maximum penalty will be forfeiture of his/her candidacy for the entire upcoming legislative session. If this determination is made after the election of the candidate-in-question, that candidate shall forfeit his election and a new election shall be held.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

#### The Elections Committee

- A. Duties and Responsibilities of the Election Chairperson.

  NOTE: The terminology "Election Chairperson" is used here and throughout this bill, however it is intended that it also represent "Election Committee Cochairpersons, if co-chairpersons are appointed and confirmed.
  - 1. The Election Chairperson shall be appointed by the Student Association Vice President with approval of the Senate.
  - 2. The Election Chairman shall appoint form amongst the Election Committee members, one supervisor for each designated polling area. These appointments are subject to approval by the Committee Members. Note that a designated area may include more than one polling place.
  - 3. The Election Chairperson shall be responsible for the final tally of the election results.
  - 4. The Election Chairperson shall seee that all duties regarding communication are carried out.
  - 5. The Election Chairperson shall oversee all supervisors, poll watchers, and any other groups or individuals involved with the operations and management of the elections.
  - 6. All other duties pertinent and necessary to the proper and effective operations of the elections, not listed here or found elsewhere in this bill, shall be assigned by the Election Chairperson to the Committee members.
- B. Duties and Responsibilities of the Election Committee Members
  - 1. Election Committee Members shall consist of any interested Senators and any other interested members of the Student Association.
    - 2. Each Election Committee Member shall be responsible for participating in any committee type activity. This shall include such events as petition validation, ballot counting, general committee meetings, and any other occasion or event that requires the participation of the whole committee.
    - 3. Various job classifications to be described in this section shall be assigned to the Election Committee Members by the Elections Chairperson. The purpose of these job classifications is for written documentation for many of the duties necessary for the proper and

efficient operation of the elections. The list is not intended to include every single job and every single detail of that job, but rather only a general guide for some of the more important jobs and duties that are necessary. If deemed necessary the Elections Chairmerson may assign additional classifications.

Polling Supervisors--Polling Supervisors shall

1) Be responsible for the areas to which they are

assigned.

NOTE:

2) Appoint all necessary poll watchers for their balloting area(s) and submit to the Election Chairperson a list of all said poll watchers and their hours the day before the election is to take place.

If some outside group or organization (non S. A. members) are to be used as poll watchers, the Election Chairperson may waive these two responsibilities if it is more appropriate for the poll watchers to be appointed and accounted for another way.

3) Be responsible for clearing all posters, publicity and electioneering material in compliance with Section I, part E of this bill, from their assigned polling areas.

4) Confiscate ballot boxes, which must be sealed each day when the polls close, and be responsible for their deliverance to the priorly designated place and person(s) at the end of the election day(s).

5) Be responsible for the availability of ballots at their respective polling areas.

6) Be present at the tally of the ballots.

7) Make sure that any party affiliation appears on the ballot if so desired by a candidate.

Not work as poll watchers.

9) Provide at each of their polling tables a list of instructions for the poll watchers and if the poll watchers are to receive a stipend, then th polling supervisor must also proved a sign in/out sheet for the poll watchers.



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- 10) WOCR And WTOP shall be requested to announce the election details and results.
- 11) The Oswegonian shall be requested to publish election details, rules and results.
- b) Petition Supervisor--the petition supervisor shall be responsible for:
  - 1) Preparing and making available a sufficient number of petitions for each S. A. election
    - a) Campus wide petitions and Senate petitions available in the S. A. office.
    - b) Senate petitions at the dorm desks having open Senate seats for that election.
  - 2) Preparing and attaching to all petitions a sheet of instructions stating the necessary dates and rules of the election.
  - 3) Making the necessary arrangements for the collection of returned petitions.
  - 4) Submitting all returned petitions to the Elections Chairperson at the time the petitions are due.
  - 5) Collecting all unused petitions at all dorm desks and the S. A. office and replacing them to the election file in the S. A. office.
- c) Poster Supervisor—the poster supervisor will be respon sible for:
  - 1) All poster advertising for all phases of the elections.
  - 2) Determining the dates of when the posters will be needed and the amount to be ordered, and in cooperation procedures for payment for material and printing.
  - 3) Getting the posters up in all necessary places.
  - 4) Retrieving as many posters as possible for possible reuse or to be kept on file as sample material.
- d) Newspaper3Ad Supervisor--the Newspaper Ad Supervisor shall be responsible for:
  - 1) All newspaper ads concerning the operational aspect of each S. A. election.
  - 2) Determining the dates in which the ads will be needed and making arrangements to have the necessary amount of newspaper space reserved.
  - 3) Designing a general layout for each ad making sure that it contains all necessary information, submitting this to the Chairperson for approval, and upon approval, submitting the layout to the newspaper.
  - 4) Making in cooperation with the Elections Chairperson, the necessary arrangement for any payment for the ad to the newspaper.



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- 5) Requesting the Oswegonian one full page containing a 64 name petition and a list of instructions.
- e) Debates Supervisor--the debates supervisor shall be responsible for:
  - Recommending to the Elections Committee the date, location, and format for the S. A. President and Vice Presidential debates.
  - 2) Notifying each of the Presidential and Vice Presidential candidates of the date, time and format of the debates, following the determination of such information by the Elections Committee.
- C. The polling supervisor shall provide the details of the elections to the constituency of their respective areas. This shall include the following:
  - Working with the poster supervisor to see that there are posters in each polling place and in all dorms and the Hewitt Union advertising 1) the availability of petitions for that election, and 2) when and where th elections will take place, in addition to the other pertinent election information.
  - Designing and placing in each polling place a poster describing how to cast a ballot.
  - 3. Providing the dorm councils included within their supervisory areas with the same basic information as provided in the posters of the above two parts.

Be it further enacted that the funds reimbursed by the Student Assembly return to contingency account #740.


